The Epilepsy Society submitted a further 26 documents to their planning application, these were uploaded to the planning portal on the 18th April. A 30-day consultation period is now open for the public and statutory consultees to submit additional comments. The closing date is the 23rd May.

The documents fall into two categories. The first is the Epilepsy Society's response to points raised by statutory consultees, plus a partial response to the SENSE4CSP submission relating to traffic. The other documents include a revised Strategic Design Code for the development site.

The SENSE core group are working closely with the Parish Council and we're looking carefully at the response documents to determine if further comments are required. The Strategic Design Code needs detailed scrutiny, but on first glance the document does nothing to redress the objections raised by the Bucks Landscape Architecture & Urban Design Team. Their report can be found on the planning portal under the ES application. The document is dated 15th March 2024 - Consultation Letter – LAUD Part 1. It's well worth a read.

The time scale for a response is tight, so unfortunately our submission may not be available to SENSE members before the deadline. However, once we have studied the documents, we will circulate guidance to help you formulate your own response. Hopefully this will be within the next couple of weeks, All submissions already received will still be considered.
